#### OUR APPROACH TO MUSIC

- Our role as BBM musicians is to provide dancers with clear tunes and rock steady, driving rhythms that mirror and emphasise the dance moves.
- 2. The dancers want an acoustic sound but instruments may be lightly amplified to balance volumes across all instruments.
- 3. Traditional folk music is *not* formally orchestrated, it's flexible and adaptive, so every musician is encouraged to harmonise and 'twiddle' subject to no 1.
- 4. Every instrument has its value so every musician will be invited to lead at least one tune.
- 5. The introduction to each tune will always be a solo by the lead musician so that one person sets the timing adjusting it to the dance leader's indicated preference. The rest of the band will join in only when the dancers start moving.
- 6. During practices we will inevitably need to check out a tune or practice some timing but we must not interfere with the dance instruction.

Bryan is writing a dance specially for us. He is still working on the stepping but he's agreed that the tune will be Twiglet (aka Theme Vannitaise).


